**RELIEF OF THE POOR.**  
**COUNTY OF LIMERICK CENTRAL**

Magistrates of the City Limerick, have presented Addresses to Captain Bindon, R. N. expressive of the high sense they entertain of his most praiseworthy exertions in protecting the loyal and industrious, whilst in command of the Water Police on the Shannon—a description of corps which was most essential in carrying into effect the arrangements made by Government, during the recent disturbance in this district.

John Kearns and John Rourke are to be executed at the drop in front of the County Jail, on Saturday next, for a burglary in the house of Mr. James Kirby.

A respite has been received for James Ready and Timothy Mulvihill, found guilty at Ennis Assizes, of burglary in the house of Patrick Cleary; a respite has also been received for Mat Healy for burglary and robbery.

At the close of the King's Co. assizes, a man named William L'Estrange was liberated by order of the Court. He had been confined in the jail of Philipstown for upwards of 20 years. His first charge was for the murder of a child; and he has been since, until within the last two years, in a deranged state of mind. A subscription was entered into by the Hon. Baron Smith, and the Gentlemen in Court, for the unfortunate man.

It is reported that Mr. Odell and the Hon. Mr. Hewitt, from the Excise Commissioners, proceed to London, under the new arrangement.
