Last night, Francis M'Innes, a Policeman, with a party of the 42d Highlanders, from Adare, proceeded to the neighbourhood of Crough, to execute a Magistrate's Warrant. When the party arrived at the dwelling of the accused person, he demanded admittance, stating his object and authority, which was refused; and while in the act of forcing an entry, he was fired at and a pistol ball lodged in his head, which killed him on the spot. The Military party, very properly, made prisoners of every person in the house, who are now in custody in the guard-house of Adare.

Tuesday night, a notice was posted near Cahirnarry, desiring John Maher and Felix O'Donnell to surrender their lands before the 1st of November, and threatening any one who took down the notice, that his fingers would be cut off. The next night four cows belonging to Maher and O'Donnell were houghed on said lands, which are part of Mr. Armstrong's estate. Information of the outrages have been received on oath by the Right Worshipful Denis Fitzgerald Mahony, Esq. Mayor of this City.

This day, James Kelly was flogged at the Old Market-house, for robbery, pursuant to sentence at the last City Sessions.
