"We have not latterly had any night work in this quarter, therefore drop you a line to let you know, that information having been privately given here that some men in the county Kerry, were again embarked in the coining business, (I say again, because they were suspected about two years since) and the information being strengthened by the appearance of some bad tenpenny pieces in the village, and also having ascertained that one of the party had given some wedges of brass to a smith to have prepared and dressed up as we think, for making a die, Mr. O'Meara, "of the 30th, with a serjeant and 12 men, started last night and returned at 9 o'clock this morning, after having searched the louwes of those people, four of whom (all brothers of the name of Keeffe,) he apprehended and brought in here; in his search he found some files, some tenpenny counterfeits, inished and unfinished, some rotten stone, and a white substance, which is used by those fellows for giving a bright appearance to the silver; a sword, which was hidden under a fellow's head in bed; a double shot pouch, with shot in it; five powder thorns, with powder in them; a parcel of bullets, and some flints. Upon returning home they met with a party of five or six fellows, one of whom they took; and he goes off to take his trial under the Insurrection Act—this was a difficult job, as they had to cross and recross two rivers full of broken pieces of ice.
