On Thursday, five villains, with their faces
blackened, attacked two men from Clonmel,
near Kilanogue, Barony of Iffa and Offa West,
County Tipperary, who murdered one of them,
named Mathew Carey.

On Saturday morning, as a young woman,
named Ellen Thompson, from the neighbourhood
of Patrick's-well, was purchasing herrings in
Broad-street, a car came in contact with her
cloak, which threw her down, and the wheel
having passed over her head, killed her on the
spot. An Inquest was held on the body in the
evening by the Mayor, when a verdict of "Acci-
dental Death" was returned.

On Sunday evening, a woman, named Shanny,
received a severe wound by falling from a hearse
in which she sat, returning from a funeral at
Parteen, one of the wheels having passed over
her neck and breast. She was conveyed to the
County Hospital, where hopes are entertained
of her recovery.

On Saturday, as two parties were fighting
outside Thomondgate, a man leading his horse
at the time, received a blow of a stone from
one of them which fractured his skull; he is
also in the County Infirmary.

On Sunday night, the house of Mr. Bodkin, of
Auna, near Tuam, was totally consumed by an
accidental fire.

Mr. William Fitton, of Cork, was near losing
his eye on Thursday, by a shot from some per-
son fowling at the Lough, near that City.

Four men, who were skating at Mr. Mitchell's
Lake, Castlestrange, County Roscommon, were
drowned on Thursday.

On Saturday last, a party of Major Warbur-
ton's Police, apprehended at Kilmurry M'Mahon,
a man named Henessy, alias Tuohy, who stands
charged with a murder committed about four
months back, in the parish of Killaloe.

Messrs. Harley and Sargent, Officers of Ex-
cise, accompanied by a party of the Rifle Bri-
