## Limerick Chronicle

SATURDAY, MARCH 22.

Today Serjeant Torrens held a Sessions  
 at the Insurrection Act, at the County  
 House, when Michael Boarke was found  
 and sentenced to be transported for seven  
 years for being of a party who appeared in arms  
 at Carlewille, on the night of the 11th inst.

At the County Assizes, John Butler, Michael  
 Connell, Stephen Shaughnessy, Matthias Dwyer,  
 William Ryan, James Lister, Wm. Condon,  
 Robin Kelly, Edmond Dundon, Thomas Flaha-  
 vin, and Michael Flahavin, were convicted of  
 Illicit Distillation, and sentenced to one month's  
 imprisonment; James Power was also convicted,  
 and sentenced to two months imprisonment.

This day, Henry Shaughnessy, the *Quack  
 Doctor*, was flogged through the town of Bruff,  
 pursuant to sentence at the last Assizes, for vio-  
 lently assaulting a female.

Daniel Sheehan, convicted at Ennis Assizes,  
 has been respited till further orders. The two  
 men found guilty of administering unlawful  
 oaths and burglary in the house of Mr. James  
 Doyle, will, it is believed, undergo the awful  
 sentence of the law. Three of the four brothers,  
 named Cummins, who had been found guilty of  
 manslaughter at Killaloe, have received a com-  
 mutation of sentence from transportation to  
 twelve months' imprisonment.

A melancholy accident happened at Kilmore,  
 County Clare, a few days ago—one of the Police  
 was brought there to shoot a mad dog, and the  
 ball after passing through the animal, rebounded  
 from a stone and unfortunately killed Mr.  
 Hickman's huntsman.

On Wednesday last, the Right Worshipful  
 D. F. G. Mahony, Esq. Mayor held an Inquest  
 on the body of Michael Halloran, who was  
 killed in an affray at Thomond-gate, on Patrick's  
 night. Verdict—"Wilful Murder."

On Thursday and yesterday, the Mayor held  
 a Court for the Registry of Freeholds—upwards  
 of eighty were registered.

William Gibson, Esq. Surgeon, is appointed  
 Inspector of the City Limerick Jail, in room of  
 the Rev. Henry Gabbins, resigned.

It is stated that Mr. Serjeant Torrens will  
 succeed Mr. Justice Fletcher in the Court of  
 Common Pleas. This elevation will give great  
 satisfaction to every individual who is acquainted  
 with the worth of the estimable and learned  
 Serjeant.

Captain Bates, R. N. is appointed Inspecting  
 Commander of the Preventive Water Guard in  
 the County of Clare—head-quarters, Miltown  
 Malbay.

His Royal Highness the Duke of Clarence  
 has been appointed to succeed Earl St. Vincent,  
 as General of Marines.

The 19th Regiment of Foot have arrived at  
 Athlone, from Dublin. The 66th are to occupy  
 the quarters of the 19th.

On to-morrow, at two o'clock, a Sermon will
