They next proceeded to a house on a farm belonging to Thomas Harding, Esq. Alderman of this City, where they demanded arms which the inhabitants declared were not there; -they persisted that there were, and remained some time in search, but not succeeding in finding any, they departed. uttering threats against the Association or Police should they meet them, and with the intention of attacking some of the mills in the neighbourhood, which, however, we do not learn they attempted. It is remarkable, that this was the first night the Police and Association had not visited that part of the district.
