SATURDAY, JUNE 7.

Thursday night, an armed party attacked the house of Richard Crofts, Esq. (father of the Sheriff elect of the City Cork), situated near Ballybeg Glyn, and on the high Mail-Coach Road between Mallow and Buttevant. Mr. Crofts, not having any arms, was obliged to admit them, and on their demanding Ten Pounds in money, which he refused to give, alleging that he had it not, one of the ruffians fired at him, the shot took effect, and we deeply regret to learn, that he was considered in imminent danger at the time the messenger left him. He was a most respectable Gentleman, of mild and amiable manners, and we have heard, remarkably popular among the lower classes.

By accounts since received, we learn that Mr. Crofts died last night.

Mr. James Bennett, Coroner, held an Inquest on the body of John Healy, who was killed at the fair of Glenogra, as stated in our last, assisted by Edward Croker, Esq. of Ballinagary; Thomas O'Grady, Esq. Grange; Robert Levers, Esq. Castle-Levers; and the Rev. Edward Croker, Athlеча; and that the verdict of a very respectable Jury was, "That the said John Healy came by his death from the stab of a bayonet he received from a Policeman in his breast, in the execution of his duty, and in his own defence."

On Wednesday, rather an interesting looking woman was observed standing on the verge of the quay opposite to where the Brig Fortitude, freighted with passengers for America, was lying—when, on hearing a shot fired, she thought it was the signal for sailing, on which she plunged into the river with a view of reaching the vessel, or abiding the consequences. She was fortunately taken up, and on being recovered, she said in explanation, that her husband was on board the vessel, having deserted her and her family.—There was an order immediately for his being landed. In future he should atone for having taken a step, that was near ending so fatal to a wife that loved him better than he deserved.

A valuable horse was drowned on Wednesday, at Meade's-quay, whilst riding; his head slipped out of the collar, and after a few steps backward, he fell over the quay.

In the King's Bench on Friday, Mr. Justice Jebb passed sentence on the Defendant of one month's confinement from the 1st day of term, in Kilmilnamh, without fine. The affidavits in mitigation and aggravation shall appear in our next.

Mr. Richard L. Connell, son of Counsellor Connell, of Cork, was admitted under Deacon's Orders, at an Ordination held by the Bishop of Cloyne, on Sunday.

Yesterday a country-man was convicted before Sir C. Marrett, for exposing to sale four casks of butter, fraudulently made up—the penalty (ten shillings for each cask), was inflicted, and applied as the Act directs.

The Church-Wardens of St. Michael's Parish acknowledge the receipt of Four Pounds Six Shillings and Eight Pence, from the Mayor, being half the fines levied, on four Persons convicted of having sold spirituous and other liquors without license. A like sum has been handed by his Worship to the Inspector-General of Excise here, for the Preventing Officer who prosecuted the cases to conviction, under the 56th of the late King.

The Steward of the House of Industry has received light butter condemned by the Mayor, and two fines of 2s. 6d. each, levied on persons having fraudulent milk measures.
