On same night, a party of men with their faces disquised, entered the house of a man named Keating, at Aughanish, on the banks of the Shannon, and flogged him desperately.

The Right Worshipful D. F. G. Mahony, as Coroner, held an Inquest at four o'clock on Wednesday, on the body of Patrick Cregan, a prisoner in the New Jail, for horse-stealing, and who had expired that morning, at nine o'clock. It appeared in evidence, that on Thursday previous, he was affected with spasins in his stomach and bowels, with which he continued to be afficted at intervals until his decease. A house in the neighbourhood of Kilpeacon was burned yesterday by accident; a child being the only person in the house having taken a candle in the inner room where a quantity of flax lay, and the candle having communicated with it, the house caught the flames, and the whole was consumed.
