Yesterday the Mayor, as Coroner, held an Inquest at Upper Hartstonge-street, on a male child found that morning in waste ground adjacent thereto, and upon due deliberation the Jury returned the following as their verdict:—  
“It appears to be a new born infant, and that it was murdered by its wicked mother or some person to us unknown, by wilfully and feloniously exposing it there to perish.”

Two donkeys belonging to Mr. James, of Tullaha, in this County, were houghed on Saturday night.

The Magistrates of the City of Cork have sworn in several Gentlemen to act as Constables in the Liberties thereof. This will prevent an additional stipendiary Police, or Constabulary force.

This County is at present perfectly peaceable and free from nightly outrage. We sincerely trust its tranquillity may be permanent.—*Kerry Paper.*

On Thursday, a party of the Limerick Revenue Police, under the command of Francis O'Shaughnessy, Esq. accompanied by Lieutenant Fennell, seized on the Galty Mountains, Co. Tipperary, two large copper stills, two heads and 2 worms, destroyed two extensive distilleries, and arrested eight men found employed in the concerns; the seizures were conveyed into Hospital, in this County. On Friday, same Officers and party seized at Derrylahin, in the County of Cork, a still, head and worm, destroyed a distillery, and arrested 6 men; the seizure was lodged in Mitchellstown.

Eighty Insolvents are to be discharged at Cork on the 4th July.

The fair of Roscrea, on Saturday, was well-attended, and black cattle and sheep fetched comparatively good prices.

Prize-Money is now issuable in London to the crews of H. M. S. Snapper, Morgiana and Brisk.

The young Gentleman who on Saturday last dropped his pocket-book, with £150 in Bank Notes, and which had been recovered, has given the Mayor Twenty Shillings, for the Mendicity Institution, which were handed over for that Charity.
