

The remainder arrive here to-day, and on Monday and Tuesday.

The 42d Highlanders will not proceed hence for Battavant until the entire of the 29th arrive.

The 2d Battalion Rifle Brigade are to arrive in the ensuing week, to replace the 42d.

The 57th from Battavant, are to replace the 2d Battalion Rifles at Kinsale.

The 42d are to be in Battavant on the 5th July, and the 57th at Kinsale on the 7th July. A detachment of the 71st Regiment quartered in Mitchelstown for the last eight months, under the command of Major Pidgeon, were relieved on Wednesday by a party of the 10th commanded by Major Dent.

Some 93d are quartered as follows:—Three companies at Mullingar, two at Longford; one at Maryborough; one at Philipstown; and one at Tallonore.

The 1st Battalion Coldstream Guards are ordered from London, to replace the 1st Grenadier Guards in Dublin, who are to return to England.

The 3d Light Dragoons have arrived at Hampton, near London.

Captain Walter O'Hara, half-pay Portuguese Army, is appointed Major of Brigade in Ireland.

Major-Gen. Sir John Elley proceeded hence on Thursday, by the Lady of the Shannon Steam Packet to Kilrush, to inspect the military posts on the Lower Shannon.

Yesterday, a part of the 12th Royal Dragoons under command of Major Eskine, went through their various lance and sword evolutions, in a field near the New Barracks—to the delight of a numerous concourse of spectators.

Sir Benjamin Bloomfield landed at Stockholm on the 15th inst.

On Monday night, two Cows were houghed on the lands of Kildimo, the property of a farmer, named Barnes; one of the animals died shortly after.

Thursday evening, Mr. Magrath, High Constable, apprehended Patrick Corry, who, a few hours before, had entered the house of Edward Bold and Maurice Kean, in the Irishtown, and stole a quantity of wearing apparel, which was found in his possession; as also a number of pawn duplicates of apparel pledged, which may be seen with Mr. Magrath. Corry is committed by Alderman Watson for trial at the ensuing Assizes.

On Thursday a large Bread-basket was stolen out of the Shop of Mr. Fisher, in Rutland-street.

A new Bridle and Saddle were stolen out of a Gentleman's Stable in Georges-street, on Wednesday night last.

On Monday night, seven insurgents, feloniously styling themselves police patrol, knocked at the door of a farm-house on the lands of Ash-Grove, which they soon entered and took thereout three firkins of butter, the property of an industrious farmer named Denis Hurly; they also rifled his son's pockets of some money, and destroyed his vessels, &c.

On Wednesday night, a farm-house, the property of Edw. Sheehy, Esq. was maliciously set on fire and consumed, on the lands of Clommore, near Dromcolloher.

Several stands of arms which were deposited in a coffin and buried in the church-yard of Killoholane, were a few days back dug up by some of the Magistrates and Police in the County Cork, to whom information had been previously given, charged with capital offences; many others have absconded.

A young man, named Hanneen, a carpenter, from Newcastle, was killed on Tuesday, at the races of Ballyea, in Kerry, by a blow of a shovel which split his skull; the blood-thirsty villain who perpetrated the heinous deed has been apprehended.

The Rev. Barry Denny was elected High Provost of Tralee for the ensuing year, on Tuesday last.

On Tuesday last, the Right Hon. Colonel Bagwell, M.P. for the County of Tipperary, was elected Mayor, and William Chaytor and James Douglas, Esqrs. Bailiffs of Clonmel, for the ensuing year.

The Earl of Kingston is appointed Magistrate for the Counties of Limerick, Tipperary, and Waterford.

Noble Hartnett, Esq. has been reinstated in the Commission of the Peace for the Co. Cork.

Thursday evening, Messrs. Scovell, Western, Tetham, and Kerr, arrived in Cork, from Waterford; those Gentlemen form a Commission, selected from the higher officers of the English Revenue Department, for the purpose of inspecting the routine of business in the principal ports throughout Ireland. They are accompanied by Mr. Worthington, Surveyor-General.

The Archbishop of Cashel is daily expected in Ireland. His Grace has not yet fixed his triennial visitations in the different diocese of his district.

We have received a communication from "an Inhabitant" complaining of the multiplicity of demands for Ecclesiastical Rates, and other alleged charges, and doubting the authority under which the same are required. We shall enquire into the nature of them, and attend to the suggestions given.
