On Saturday morning last, as Stephen Fitzgerald, Proctor to the Rev. Mr. Graves, valuing tithes on the lands of Craves, in this County, was attacked by five men in their shirts and faces blackened, armed with a hurly and spade-handle, who gave him six cuts in his head and several blows on the body—the Police arrived to his assistance, and removed him to his house near Cappa, but were not able to detect the fellows.

On Monday morning last, between the hours of five and six o'clock, a man, named Cope, who had been placed (with two others, who escaped) as keepers on the crops, &c. on the lands of Bolane, in the Barony of Kenry, in this County, was beat in a most unmerciful manner by a number of men dressed in womens' clothes. His life is despaired of.

On Friday last, John Mc'Mahon, a most notorious character, was arrested through the indefatigable exertions of Captain Dumas and a party of his police, stationed at Hospital, for passing forged notes on four or five attornies at the last Quarter Sessions held at Bruff. This is the third notorious character apprehended by that officer within these last few days—one of whom evaded justice for these fourteen months past for the murder of Downs, in the County Tipperary.

On Monday last, Mr. Blackburne, assisted by Messrs. Holland, Acting Assistant-Barrister, held a Special Sessions under the Insurrection Act, in the County Court. On the Bench were:

James Carmody, of Fininertown, was put to the bar, for being absent from his residence on the night of the 25th August, and running from the Police when called—Acquitted. The Court gave his case a merciful consideration, it appearing he was on business at the fair of Rathkeale.

The Court adjourned to Friday next. Mr. Blackburne proceeded on Monday to the City Court, to hold a Sessions under the Insurrection Act. We have the satisfaction to say, that not a person appeared for trial.

Mr. Blackburne will preside at a Sessions at Six-Mile-Bridge to-morrow.

The clemency of the Marquis Wellesley's Government was fully illustrated by the arrival of a King's Messenger in this city, at two o'clock, on Sunday, with a respite for Jeremiah Nunan, who was to be hanged on the day following.—The respite was had in consequence of an application from several respectable inhabitants of this City, who from the circumstances attending the previous respite of Nunan, were led to address his Excellency in the following words:—

To his Excellency the Marquis Wellesley, &c. We, the undersigned Citizens of Limerick, impressed with sentiments of the most profound respect and attachment to your Excellency's person and government, humbly approach your Excellency in a case which has excited an intense feeling in this City, and in which we anxiously hope the sympathies of your Excellency's heart will decide in mercy.

The case we humbly submit to your Excellency's consideration is that of Jeremiah Nunan, ordered to be executed on Monday next, for an offence committed in this County. This unfortunate man, may it please your Excellency, was

Yesterday, Lieut.-Colonel William Dickson, C. B. of the Madras Cavalry, arrived in this City, after an absence of many years in India.

Lieut.-General Viscount Beresford, G. C. B. and G. C. H. who succeeded the late Lieut.-General Sir Hildebrand Oakes, Bart. as Lieut.-General of Ordnance, has also been appointed a Commissioner of the Royal Military College, and a Commissioner of the Royal Military Asylum.

The appointment held by the late Lieutenant-General Sir Hildebrand Oakes, Bart. at the Consolidated Board of General Officers, for the Inspection and Regulation of the Clothing of the Army, the Investigation of Claims for Losses, and for all Duties heretofore performed by the Clothing Board, Board of Claims, and other Boards of General Officers, has not been filled up.

The office of Esquerry to the Duke of York has, in consequence of the death of the late General Sir Charles Asgill, Bart. become vacant.

The following is the present distribution of the 40th Regiment:—Lieut. Low, with a detachment, sailed from Portsmouth in the Albion, with convicts, in May last; Captain Bishop, from Woolwich, in the Asia, in the early part of August; Lieut. Millar, from Cove, in the Isabella, a few days since; Captain Hibbert and Ensign Williams, from Sheerness, in the Sir Godfrey Webster, about the 8th ult.; Lieut. Thornhill, from Portsmouth, in the Guildford. Lieut. Ganning and Ensign Curtin, with Assistant-Surgeon Coleman, arrived at Cove a few days ago, in the Medina, and expect to sail shortly. The Castle Forts has arrived at Cove to receive convicts; Lieut.-Colonel Balfour and his family, with Lieut. Richardson, go out in private. The detachments each consist of thirty privates, with a proportion of Non-commissioned Officers—some ships two Officers, and others only one. Each ship takes from 180 to 200 convicts. The head-quarters, with the remainder of the Regt. are still at Clatham. Several other ships are expected to go out with convicts about the end of the year. It is therefore probable that the whole of the Regiment will be out of England before the spring of next year.

Captain O'Donnell's troop of the 15th hussars, arrived at Ipswich from Norwich, on Thursday last.

His Majesty's brigs Arab and Pelorus, and Vandelear Revenue-Cruiser, sailed from Cove on Sunday last.

Monday a dividend of 2s. 6d. in the pound (in addition to a former one of 5s. and one year's interest on all outstanding debts, making in all 8s. 8d. in the pound) was commenced being paid at the former Banking concern on the South Mall Cork, where Thomas Cuthbert, Esq. the acting Trustee, and Thomas Martin, Esq. Receiver, under the Court of Chancery, attended for the purpose. The business of every individual was dispatched with facility and promptness, as, from previous arrangements, the amount of the dividend which each creditor had to receive was struck, and immediately upon producing the document which entitled him to it, he was handed a check on the Bank of Messrs. Leslie, which, although Mondays are always observed as bank holidays, was liberally opened at an early hour for the public accommodation, and an opportunity thus afforded of enabling persons who had come from the country to return without the least difficulty or delay.

A new Court-House is ordered to be erected in Galway.
