

Cadiz. General Alava re-tore the city at the moment when anarchy was in its height. . . . Whether it was that he could not bring parties to participate in his views, or that the Exaltados have prevailed, the time granted by the Prince has elapsed: General Alava has not again presented himself, and conformably to the orders of his Royal Highness, hostilities have re-commenced, and the firing of Artillery is heard in the direction of fort Puntales. The whole army is rejoiced."

An official despatch from General Mina states, that in a general action he had with Marshal Money, at the head of 10,000, French, the latter lost 600 in killed, 900 wounded and 170 prisoners, with one hundred mules laden with baggage. A French fleet has appeared off the coast of Venezuela.

Two French Privateers of immense value, were brought into Teneriffe a few weeks ago, captured by the Spaniards.

Four hundred houses were burned in the Bavarian town of Hof, on the 4th of September.

Several Americans from the States are emigrating to Canada.

Mr. Henry Bullen, of Salisbury, was killed by a fall from his horse on Thursday.

WINDSOR, SEPTEMBER 10.

This afternoon, at two o'clock, his Majesty arrived at the Castle in his travelling carriage, drawn by four bay horses, from the Lodge, attended by the Master of the horse, and the Lord Steward, escorted by a party of the Royal Horse Guards, followed by Sir Edmund Nagle, and Admiral Keppel in another carriage. The King proceeded to hold a Court, which was attended by—

The First Lord of the Treasury, the Secretaries of State for the Foreign and Home Departments, the Chancellor of the Exchequer, the Lord Steward of the Household, the Comptroller of the Household, the Master of the horse, Sir C. Long, &c.

His Majesty held a Privy Council, at which Parliament was further prorogued to the 10th of November.

The King also signed a Proclamation to give currency to double sovereigns.

The Earl of Liverpool, Mr. Secretary Canning, and the Chancellor of the Exchequer had audiences of his Majesty.

The Council broke up at half past three o'clock, when the King left the Castle for the Lodge.

The Footmen and Porters from the Lodge were in attendance. A great concourse of persons were assembled for the purpose of seeing his Majesty.

It is expected the King will visit Brighton for a short time before the latter end of November, and before he returns to London to reside there.

A circumstance of a very painful nature occurred on Thursday at the Barracks, in County Wick, which we are sorry it has fallen to our duty to record, particularly as the Regiment it has taken place in, is remarkable, while in this garrison for the gentlemanlike deportment of the officers and the general good conduct of the men. One private of the 12th Lancers, named McCann, who had been slightly reprimanded, as we have been informed, applied for a Court-Martial, which was as promptly complied with, but while it was depending, and a verdict grounded on the former decisions likely to be returned, he repaired to the stables, provided with his pistols, and had been there a short time when a Lieut. of the Regiment, went in, whom he fired at; the bullet passed close to the body, and most providentially missed him. The unfortunate man then presented the other pistol to his head to commit self-destruction, which we regret to state he so far succeeded as to mangle it in such a manner as to leave little hope of his recovery. McCann had been servant to Captain Vandeleur.
