DEATH OF THOMAS ORMSBY, ESQ.

On Thursday morning, died, at his house, in

in principle---he was equally respected for his rank and his virtues -- indeed, did we not previously know and appreciate his worth, the general anxiety that prevailed during his short but fatal illness, developed the measure of his character in the opinion of his fellow Citizens. Mr. Ormsby filled the office of Mayor of this City in the year 1821 - 22, and, dignified as that office is, the unbending integrity of his mind, shed additional lustre on the Civic Chair,

As a Magistrate, possessing a sound judgment, and a clear understanding, his decisions were cautious, correct, and free from prejudice and party bias ; they were, therefore, received with cheerfulness, and fully calculated to maintain for the laws of his country, that respect to which they are so eminently entitled. But, Mr. Ormsby was not one of those Magistrates, who, while they require others to be just, practice not the precepts they enforce; no man was more punctual or correct in his dealings, or who gave more satisfaction or more scrupulously regarded his word; his integrity was so rigid and so well ascertained, that, by those who knew

him, his word was deemed equal to the strictest

legal bond.

in his own family, where every amiable trait in it appeared heightened, and by them he was almost idolized; who then can describe the loss or paint the sorrow of a tender and affectionate wife, from whose arms death hath torn him; of a fond, fond mother, to whom he was dearer than life itself; and of brothers and an only sister, to whom he was both a father and a Guardian! O God! how unsearchable are thy judgments, and thy ways past finding out, in removing him thus soon; but we bow to thy decree. assured that infinite wisdom cannot err, and that

infinite goodness chooses what is best! He was in the entire possession of his facul-

ties to the last moment of his existence, and conversed on the close of that existence with placid serenity and pious resignation. He was embued by that moral and religious education, which enabled him to contemplate the approach of death with humble hope and chearful resignation. It must be great consolation to the amiable and excellent family which mourns him, to think that, a life, short as it was, and spent as it was, in innocence and virtue, enabled him, with a conscience void of offence, to close, without a sigh, his eyes upon the scenes of this world, while they opened with a smile upon the prospects of a better. By his death, the Adjutantcy of the City of Limerick Regiment becomes vacant; for many years he commanded the Light Company in that
