WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 23.

John White, Esq. assisted by  
 Mr. Haynes, Walsh, Southwell,

The States schooner, with 130 hog-  
 heads, and staves, has arrived in  
 Cork from Richmond; in endeav-  
 ouring to get into dock on Wednesday even-  
 ing (the weather quite moderate) a sudden  
 gale in among the rocks at Renmore  
 wrecked the Pier, where she lay all  
 night. It would have been totally lost, had it  
 not been for the wind most providentially shift-  
 ing off the shore, which enabled her  
 to get off the following tide, free of damage, to  
 the use of every seafaring person that  
 visits the port. When we recollect that this is the  
 first vessel that has been stranded  
 (or wrecked) in our harbour within the last  
 year, of which vessels proved a total  
 loss, we consider that the duty upon  
 the United States alone, amounts  
 to £50,000, we cannot hesitate  
 to make if the situation of this port and  
 the means made known to the Lords of the  
 Treasury, that they would not refuse  
 the means to give facility and protec-  
 tion to that frequent trade—an accom-  
 modation not withheld from the meanest  
 vessel on the coasts of this Kingdom.
