On Sunday night last, a valuable in-calf heifer
was maliciously killed on the lands of Gurteen,
Parish of Quin, County Clare, the property of
Mr. C. Reddan. Those lands were some time
since in the hands of cottier tenants, who were
forgiven an immense arrear, on giving up the
lands to the owner, Richard Creagh, Esq. of
Dangan, who subsequently let them to the pre-
sent tenant.

On Monday night, the watchman stationed
in Upper William-street, in going his rounds,
found a ladder placed against the back wall of
Messrs. Roche's stores, and two fellows standing
near it, who immediately ran off. He removed
the ladder, and gave the alarm, when a search
was made on the roof, and a fellow found con-
cealed, whose intention was to remove the lead
from the gutter. He was committed to Jail.

On Monday night last, Mr. James Molony,
of Ballycahane, had his right hand so very much
injured by the going off of a gun he had just
charged for the purpose of going out shooting
before day the following morning, that one of the
fingers was obliged to be amputated by Surgeon
Franklin. A great quantity of the powder
lodged in his face, and materially injured both
his eyes, but he is since much better.

The Mayor held an Inquest at the County
Infirmary, on the body of James Belleher,

forfeiture.
