MURDER OF JOHN HARNETT.

At five o'clock on Tuesday morning, the Gentlemen who were investigating this affair, at the house of Mr. Kelly, in Abbeyseale, were suddenly alarmed by a shout from the soldier who had the custody of one of the murderers, Morty Flinn. They immediately ran into the street, when it appeared that the prisoner had burst the sash of the window, and succeeded in getting his body through, when the alarm given by the sentry, (who had been standing close by him,) brought the soldiers on guard at the barrack to his assistance, by which the escape of the prisoner was prevented. In the scuffle he received two slight bayonet wounds. One of the prisoners was lodged in the guard-room, the only place of safety in the town; the other two were kept at the house of Mr. Kelly, Assistant Civil Engineer, where the investigation took place, and but for whose attention, and the accommodation he so cheerfully afforded, there would have been much difficulty in making that speedy and minute inquiry, which has been so productive of success. About twelve o'clock on Tuesday, the prisoners were sent, under a strong escort of the 29th, to Newcastle, having been previously pinioned, and connected by a rope at intervals of about four yards. The investigation is still going on, and every hour throws some new light on the business. The deceased, John Harnett, was nephew to the prisoners, Flinns.
