from Europe. The fortifications on the sea coast were re-
pairing with all expedition, and the strong hold of Puerto
Cabello would, it is said, be shortly rendered impregnable.
—Generals Paez and Bermudez entered this place on the 1st
of December, with the brave troops who effected its con-
quest. The foreign merchants at Lagunayra, natives of
Spain and of the Canaries, who have been expelled the coun-
try by a late decree of the Colombian Government, had pe-
titioned the Intendant to be allowed to prolong their stay a
sufficient time to settle their affairs, in which they were
joined by several Colombian houses, who were deeply inte-
rested in the subject. The nature of the Intendant's reply is
not stated. The Venezuela frigate, Bolivar corvette, and
a 64-gun ship, sailed from Lagunayra on the 19th of Decem-
ber, with military stores for Puerto Cabello.
