Duties on Raw Silks imported are to be levied in the following manner:---East India Silk, from 4s. to 3s. per lb. China and Java Silk, from 5s. 6d. to 6d. per lb.---Brazilian Raw Silk, from 14s. 10d. to 7s. 6d. per lb. Prohibitions on Foreign Manufactured Silks are to be removed, and Plain Silks are to be admitted at 15s. per lb.; Figured Silks at 30 per lb.; and all other Silk Goods at 30 per cent on their value. A number of fancy articles and articles of dress, which are now prohibited, and furnish the trade of the French Silversmiths, are to be admitted on a payment of 10 per cent. *ad valorem*.

The inhabitants of Galway, have presented a piece of plate to Mathew Thomas Smyth, Esq. Sheriff, as a small token of respect for the manner in which he discharged his duty.

A piece of Plate has been presented by the prisoners to Rev. Richard St. George, late Rector of Temple Michael, Longford.

Mr. Smith Barry has arrived from England. The Anna, and Amelin, from New-York, 1214 hogsheads of Flaxseed, are daily exported at Westport, County Mayo.

A Gentleman arrived in Galway, to enquire the mode in which the funds of Erasmus Smith's School there are applied.

There has been a vast increase to the Orange Societies in Dublin this month.

A fire broke out on Sunday morning, on board the ship, but was got under without mischief. The house of Thomas Melvin, of Kilgavin, County Mayo, was robbed on Friday night.

There are 64 to be tried at the Assizes of the County, 14 are for murder.

We understand a powerful Operatic Company is engaged for our Theatre, and expected in a few days.

Three Millions of Herrings were sold in Galway, on Thursday, at from 16s. to 20s. per thousand.

Mr. Luke White has left three sons---his eldest son is married to the daughter of Lord Mount Gort.

The Insurrection Act was held at Naas, before Mr. Bennett, K. C. The Earl of Mayo, and several other Magistrates were present. Three men named Carroll, Stone, and Lynch, who had been apprehended on the night of the 15th ult. by Mr. Powell, were placed upon their trial, and after a most patient investigation, were found guilty. It appeared that Carroll had deserted from the 4th Dragoon Guards, on the night previously to that on which Mr. Powell arrested him. The defence set up by the prisoners was the usual one, an alibi, but the witnesses brought forward to support it, disagreed so materially in the testimony, that the Bench were unanimously of opinion that no credence whatever should be placed in any thing which had been stated by them. Mr. Bennett pronounced the judgment of the Court, which was, that they should be transported for seven years. The prisoners were immediately transmitted to Dublin under an escort of Police.

At Cashel Sessions, under the Insurrection Act, held before Mr. Blake and 16 Magistrates, on Wednesday and Thursday, Pat. Ryan and Patrick Heffernan, of Tipperary, were tried for being absent from their dwellings, and sentenced to 7 years' transportation; 27 others were tried and acquitted. The Court adjourned to the 13th instant.

At Nenagh Sessions, under the Insurrection Act, 12 were tried and acquitted.

On Friday night last, Molony's turf-boat of Skeagh, lying at anchor below Graigue Island, in this river, was run foul of and instantly sank, by which two of the crew were unfortunately drowned; another took to the mast and was saved by the vigilance and activity of Captain Yoward, of the brig Mary of Workington.---The remains of the crew were

found in the cabin of the wreck, on Monday evening. The Mayor held inquisitions on the bodies yesterday.---Verdict accidentally drowned.

Last night, an aged man, named Roche, a collar maker, was found dead in Mungret-street. The Mayor will hold an inquest in the course of the day, to ascertain how he came by his death.

On Saturday last John Cox, Esq. Coroner, held an inquest on the body of John Sculan, servant to a farmer, at Ballynaboga, in this County, who hanged himself with a rope collar in the stable. No reason could be assigned for the rash act. Verdict insanity.

James Shinner, from the neighbourhood of Grange, was on Friday received into the County Hospital with several dangerous wounds, the effects of a severe beating; also Mary Gleeson, from Castle-Connell, was admitted with a fractured thigh.

The concerns of Mr. Dillon, in High-street, were broken into on Monday night, and a quantity of Pork stolen thereout.

Nearly fifty Geese and Turkeys were stolen from Cratloe on Saturday night.
