On Sunday last, Major Carter committed to the County Jail of Cork, ten men, charged with being concerned in burning the barracks at Churchtown, and murdering the Police.

It is said that the Attorney-General leaves Dublin this day, for Cork, to conduct the prosecutions of the ten men taken by Major Carter, and their three associates apprehended in London, and now at Cork, for burning Churchtown Barracks. Bresnahan, one of the latter, is identified by a Policeman, who was wounded at Churchtown.

A young man named Fitz-Gerald, who had some time back escaped from the bridewell of Rathkeale, where he was confined under serious charges, died in a cabin near Kesh, suffering from cold and fatigue contracted a complication of disorders, by lying out at night to evade justice.

On Monday last, William Howell, a sailor on board the *Duke of Wellington*, merchant vessel, at our quays, fell into the hold, in a state of intoxication, and was dreadfully bruised—he was conveyed to the County Infirmary, where he lies in a dangerous condition.
