This evening, nine men, from the Petty Sessions at Patrick's-Well, were lodged in the County Jail, to be tried under the Insurrection Act; they were taken at a wake, on the 9th inst.

Yesterday being Good Friday, was observed in this City with every religious respect, the shops were closed, business suspended, and the different places of worship were crowded to excess, by the inhabitants and military.

Upwards of 1500 persons were at the Oratorio, at St. Michael's Chapel, on Thursday evening.

James Bennett, Esq. Coroner, held an inquest on Tuesday, on the body of Thomas Bourke, a hoy about 14 years of age, who came by his death in consequence of a horse taking head near Fedamore-hill, and the wheel of a cart loaded with turf rolling over his body; verdict accordingly.

A man named Connell was killed in the neighbourhood of Tubrid, County Kerry, on Saturday evening last, in a quarrel, originating in his attempting to walk across another person's field.

A Shopkeeper at Tullow was robbed of a large quantity of Cloths on Sunday night.

At the Petty Sessions held at Pallas Kenty on Monday last, John Drum was convicted on the oath of Constable William Dann, for having in his possession several trees which he could not account for. The timber was secreted in a garden convenient to his house, and over which cabbage plants were sown, which added considerably to his guilt. The trees were cut on Castletown demesne, the seat of John Waller Esq. who was pleased to reward the Police with £5, for their meritorious conduct on the occasion. This is a fine picture of the depravity to which the peasantry of this Country have arrived, when the property of this truly benevolent and invaluable Gentleman, is abused by individuals who are continually partaking of his unbounded generosity and goodness.

The Prussian ship Diana, with timber, being the first importation direct from Memel to Tralee, arrived there on Monday.

Three vessels with passengers, sailed from Waterford, for Quebec, on Wednesday.

The streets will be quite clear of strolling beggars in a few days, as the Mendicity Society, under the authority of the Magistrates, have selected men whose principal duty will be to apprehend these idle drones, who are to be committed to prison under the Vagrant act.
