The following are among the late regulations
of drawbacks and bounties on Linen:—No bounty
to be allowed on any Linen exported from Ire-
land, unless the same is of the breadth of twenty-
five inches and upwards, in like manner as in
Great Britain, under the laws in force. The
bounty payable in Ireland of 1½d. per square-
yard on Diaper, Hackaback, and Sheetting not
to be paid, unless such goods exceed the value of
1s. 6d. the running yard, in like manner as in
Great Britain under the laws in force.
