MELANCHOLY EVENT.

On Tuesday evening, Mr. Anthony Brady,
brother of Captain Brady, of Raheen, with Mr.
Henry Fosbery, and William Roughan, were
upset in a boat in Scarriff Bay, County Clare,
when returning to the shore from fishing. Messrs.
Brady and Fosbery had got near the shore, and
turned round to a man who was outside of them,
supported by an oar, and told him they were
both out of danger—but, in a few minutes, they
were dashed against a rock and sunk! Brady
and Fosbery's bodies, which are much disfigured,
were picked up on Wednesday, and conveyed
to Captain Brady's house. The fourth man, who
clung to the oar and could not swim, was drifted
safely to the land. Mr. Brady was not more
than about 25 years of age; he was sincerely
respected and esteemed by the country at large,
and to his respectable family, not only the loss
of such a fine fellow, but the manner in which
it occurred, must be truly afflicting. Roughan,
who is not yet found, was a fisherman, and was
one of the persons tried at the last assizes of
Ennis, for firing at Sir William Reid.
