

this City, by Mr. O'Shaughnessy, and a party of his Police. A barn brewery was heretofore carried on in the concerns, and which, it appears, was occasionally converted into a distillery.

Mr. John Boyle, Proprietor of the *Cork Freeholder*, was knocked down by a severe blow on the head from a weapon, by a person unknown, in the streets, on Monday night; his recovery is doubtful.

A considerable opposition occurred at Skibbereen Quarter Sessions, as to the election of a Chairman; the majority appointed the Assistant-Barrister Mr. Martley, which was opposed by Messrs. Townsend, Fleming, Somerville, and Freke, who sent a written protest to the Clerk of the Peace, objecting to the legality of any of the Criminal Proceedings at the Session, and desiring to have the same entered upon the Records of the Court. The Learned Chairman, however, with a very full Bench of Magistrates, proceeded forthwith to despatch the Criminal Business.

Yesterday morning, Catherine Hurly, whilst bathing at the King's Island, was carried off by the current, and would have been lost, but for the humane exertions of Michael Kenny, a labourer, who immediately plunged in, caught her when going under one of the arches of Thomond-bridge, and brought her safe to shore.

Yesterday a poor woman named Margaret Stanners, who made a practice of frequenting the quays to obtain relief from masters of vessels, unfortunately fell into the dock, at Shannouquay, at low water, and was so dreadfully injured by the accident, that she died in an hour after at the County Infirmary.

William Conway was on Thursday received into the Infirmary, suffering from the effects of a compound fracture in the leg, and was yesterday obliged to undergo amputation below the knee. Several persons have died of fever in this City last week.

Notwithstanding an assertion to the contrary, we repeat that Government ordered an inquiry to be made into the representations made of the want of potatoes, in a portion of the Counties of Clare and Galway, and we are happy indeed to find that there is no scarcity apprehended.

By a letter from the Rev. James O'Regan, R. C. Curate of St. John's, in this City, to the Roman Catholic Association, it appears that in that parish alone there are 17 private schools, containing 703 scholars, the Monks' school, containing 784, and Sunday school, 1421—total, 2908; without any aid from the Kildare-street Society. The books used are, History of the Bible, Life of Christ, Moral Entertainment, Challoner's Meditations, Think well on't, Thomas-a-Kempis, Virtuous Scholar, Preparations for Death; and others of the same sort.

Several persons having been bitten this week by dogs, the keepers of these animals are informed that all dogs found in the streets or markets after Monday next, without logs, will be put to death.

Thursday, a firkin of Butter, packed contrary to Law, was brought before Alderman Watson; the owner was fined 7s. 6d. which was disposed of as the Act directs.
