# The Limerick Chronicle

Monday last, John Hayes of Cappagh, farmer, went in company with his brother-in-law, to view the lands of Routagh, in the liberties of this City, which they intended to propose for as tenants; on retiring from thence, they were surrounded by a large party of men who wounded Hayes in the most savage manner: in fact, they did not abstain from beating him until they conceived he was dead. Information having reached the Office of Police, a party immediately proceeded to where Hayes lay in a senseless state, and yesterday morning he was moved to this City, and is now under the care of Surgeon Lloyd. The Mayor and Sir Christopher Marrett attended at the bed-side of Hayes, who through fear of becoming obnoxious to the Rock system it is supposed, declined to afford any information.

James Sweeny, who was beat at Knocklong fair, on Friday, died on Tuesday, when James Bennett, Esq. Coroner, held an inquest on the body, and a verdict of "Wilful Murder" was returned against several persons, four of whom have been apprehended by Captain Damas, and lodged in the County Jail.

The men in the City Jail under sentence for petty larcenies, were extremely riotous on Sunday, in consequence of the Inspector having directed the salutary regulations of the Prison to be strictly adhered to. Some of them surrounded the Inspector, and assaulted him; they then bolted their doors, which they declined opening, until Sheriff Piercy and a military party attempted to force them open. An enquiry into the affair took place on Monday by the Mayor and Magistrates, when informations were received for the assault against two of the principals, who will be tried at the Sessions, and the remaining nine were ordered to seven days solitary imprisonment, on reduced allowance.

Monday, Anne Bergin, Eleanor Moore and Hourigan, sentenced at our last assizes to transportation, were forwarded from the City Jail, by the mail, to Cork, thence to be shipped for Botany Bay.

Serjeant Goold has adjourned the Sessions under the Insurrection Act, at Kilkenny, to the 8th of July.

Commissioner Parsons arrived on Monday at Wicklow, and held a Court for the discharge of Insolvents; he will be at Tralee on the 4th of July; at Limerick, on the 7th; and in Ennis on the 9th.

A man named Dray, from Newmarket, was convicted at the Sessions under the Insurrection Act, at Mallow, on Thursday, and sentenced to seven years transportation.

There was an Ordination holden in the Parish of Carlow on Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday, by Doctor Doyle, when Holy Orders were conferred upon seven young Gentlemen. Trinity Term commenced on Monday, and the Judges sit to-day, and Term will close on the 7th July.

Mr. Lloyd, the eldest son of the late Lord of the Manor, was on Monday chosen from a list of candidates, to fill the vacant Fellowship at Trinity College, Dublin. At the same time the following Students were elected: John Whiteside, John Stafford, Peter Ryall, John M'Caul, John Alexander Major, John Wall, junr, James Lemmings, Mathew Baker, Charles Maurice M'Caw, James Smith, James Michael Wall, Roger Cullinan, John and William O'Shaughnessy.

At a Special Vestry, held on the 10th inst. in the Parish Church of the Union of Carlow (of which the Very Rev. Dean Hay is the Incumbent,) re-assembled at the request of the parishioners, it was resolved to come under the provisions of the Tithe Composition Act. An adjournment was agreed to until the 5th of July next, for the purpose of obtaining further information on the subject of the proposed amended Act, now in progress.

The Galway Advertiser states, that several loads of potatoes have arrived there from America, which was represented to be
