Yesterday, an inquest was held at Sourega, near Clarina, in this County, before Thomas P. Vokes, Esq. the Rev. Richard Dickson, and Villiers Peacocke, Esq. on the body of Patrick Griffin, who was way-laid and beaten by Patrick Croneen, on Saturday last; on the body of the deceased appeared many contusions, and wounds on the head. On the examination of Surgeon Franklin, jun. who opened the brain, it appeared clearly that the deceased came by his death in consequence of convulsions from the injury received, and the jury returned a verdict accordingly. Croneen immediately absconded, and has not since been heard of; the Police are on the alert, and every hope is entertained that the villain may be soon apprehended. Through the intervention of Providence, a little boy, aged 16 years, was near the spot, and was the means of bringing to light this murder; he gave his testimony in the clearest manner.

The Rev. Mr. M'Carthy, P. P. of Ballylongford, was, we are informed, on Wednesday last, accidentally slightly wounded, by a gun-shot wound from the fowling-piece of a gentleman, who was returning to Tarbert from a shooting party that day.
