to Clonmel Gaol.

In a scuffle at a public house in Bruff, on Fri-
day, between James Butler and Charles Carroll,
the former received a wound from a bayonet by
the latter, who is a Constable, and who has been
lodged in Jail.

On Saturday an inquest was held at Bally-
martin, near Pallas Kenry, by John Cox, Esq.
Coroner, on the body of John Mann, who came
to his death by a blow which he received from
Jacob Corneale, at the Quay of Ringmoylan,
a few weeks ago.—Verdict accordingly.
