On Wednesday last, as James Lee, land-
steward to George Massy, Esq. and Patrick
McCarthy, gardener, were returning from Bal-
lingarry to Glenwilliam, after distraining some
cattle, they were fired at from behind a ditch,
but fortunately received no injury.

On Saturday, several armed men broke into
the house of George Hore, a farmer, near Castle-
town-Roche, County Cork, which they robbed,
and also wounded some of the family.

A party of ruffians who attempted to break
into the house of Thomas Pim, in the barony of
Fermoy, on Friday, were repulsed, after an ex-
change of shots.

Bridget Shelly is lodged in Clonmel Gaol, for
the murder of Ellen Lahy, at Dundrum.

Six fellows charged with murder, have been
apprehended, and committed to the County Jail
this week.

There are ninety-three Assizes criminals at
present in our County Jail.

Forty are for trial at our City Assizes—six on
capital charges.

There are sixty criminals in Ennis Jail, for
trial at the approaching Assizes for that County,
exclusive of several who are out upon bail.

Seven journeymen bakers, named Raymond,
Downes, Driscoll, Ahern, Cott, Lombard and
Cleary, are lodged in Cork Jail, for combination
and attempting to kill Timothy Kiely, near
Capeville, on Tuesday.

Yesterday, a stout young man, named Richard
Punch, a labourer at the Lunatic Asylum, went
after his work to bathe in a quarry, near Garry-
owen; unacquainted with the place he lost his
footing, sunk in deep water and being unable to
swim, was unfortunately drowned before assis-
tance could arrive to him. The body was taken
up in less than 20 minutes; every exertion was
made use of to restore animation, but without
success—the vital spark was extinct.

A post-chaise driving down Catherine-street
on Monday night, met with a serious accident;
a vault has been lately opened in that street,
the chaise came unexpectedly in contact with it,
by which the driver and horses were thrown
and sadly injured by the unexpected shock.
No watchman was set over this dangerous spot,
nor any fence to protect the unwary.
