Killaloe and Kilfenora held his Primary Visitation at the Cathedral, which was very numerously attended. A most appropriate Sermon was preached by the Rev. Mr. Stackpoole. The Bishop's charge was most impressive and truly Christian-like. , On the subject of Tithe Composition, his Lordship said, that though he was not heretofore an advocate for its adoption, yet it now having become the law of the land and divested of many of its objectionable clauses, he felt it his duty to recommend its adoption generally; exactions, and an anxiety to obtain or look for too much, he deprecated in strong terms, though he was satisfied no such feeling existed among his Clergy, and he had made it a subject of particular inquiry; but the enemies of the Establishment have given out reports of suck a nature, and it was his wish to warn them. On residence he spoke emphatically; it was one of the duties he would most rigidly insist upon, and no Clergyman should leave his parish unless casually, without an intimation to him.
