The Court has deemed it advisable to make a rule, not to permit any professional person to interfere at the proceedings of the Petty Sessions.

On Thursday last, the Lord Bishop of Killaloe and Killfenora held his Primary Visitation at the Cathedral, which was very numerously attended. A most appropriate Sermon was preached by the Rev. Mr. Stackpole. The Bishop's charge was most impressive and truly Christian-like. On the subject of Tithe Composition, his Lordship said, that though he was not heretofore an advocate for its adoption, yet it now having become the law of the land and divested of many of its objectionable clauses, he felt it his duty to recommend its adoption generally; exactions, and an anxiety to obtain or look for too much, he deprecated in strong terms, though he was satisfied no such feeling existed among his Clergy, and he had made it a subject of particular inquiry; but the enemies of the Establishment have given out reports of such a nature, and it was his wish to warn them. On residence he spoke emphatically; it was one of the duties he would most rigidly insist upon, and no Clergyman should leave his parish unless casually, without an intimation to him. Against trafficking in lands or otherwise, his Lordship also warned the Clergy; and concluded by exhorting them to be mindful in the ministry of their Great Lord and Master.

The Lord Bishop of Kilmore, has left the See House for Harrowgate.

The Gas Company have commenced their operations, preparatory to lighting this City with Gas, agreeable to contract.

The number of labourers employed upon the Bridge works, has been considerably increased within the last few days.

The alarm which the calling in of the Six Shilling Tokens has created among the lower order, is much abated by the Collector of Customs changing them for all poor persons who apply at his Office.

A young lad named Stapleton, was yesterday received into the County Infirmary with his leg much lacerated, from having come in contact with two cars.

A young woman named Dungan, suddenly fell dead this day in the streets: she now lies in the City Court House, when an inquest will be held on the body.

The Fair of Croom, on Wednesday, was very good, and a great deal of stock was disposed of, particularly Milch Cows, which were very generally looked after and fetched excellent prices. Pigs were also in demand, and any of a good description were eagerly bought up.
