No price fixed for Ox hides, but Tallow rates at 6s. per stone. There has not, as yet, any cattle been sent from hence to Cork, and the sceders in this part of the Country prefer slaughtering in Limerick, if the prices encourage them to do so; but the Merchants will not name a price for some time, though they are willing to receive the beef.
