MURDER AT BILBOA.

Committed to the County Jail, by the Rev.
 Rickard Lloyd, Rev. Charles P. Coote, Michael
 Furnell, and John D. White, Esqrs. John
 Deagan, Darby Ryan, and Timothy Ryan, for
 the wilful murder of Daniel Connell, on the
 night of the 5th instant; by Michael Furnell,
 Esq. John Dwyer, Thomas Dwyer, Darby Ryan,
 and Martin Ryan, on suspicion of being con-
 cerned in the aforesaid murder. By the above
 committals it may be clearly perceived that the
 Magistrates and Police have been particularly
 fortunate in investigating every clue to this horrid
 crime, which has inflicted an indelible stigma
 upon the moral character of the peasantry of
 this Country. The Police actuated upon such
 an occasion by the most laudable spirit of acti-
 vity, have succeeded in apprehending, on the
 same charge, four others in addition to the above,
 so that under existing circumstances a doubt can-
 not be entertained but justice will ere long be
 fully satisfied with the punishment of the mur-
 derers, for the evidence against them is already
 strong and sufficient. It has been since ascer-
 tained that there were at least ten armed men in
 the house on the fatal night, besides those ob-
 served outside, two of whom kept watch at a
 window and prevented the escape of the inmates.
 One of those committed, Timothy Ryan, has
 been identified by Michael Connell, as the per-
 son who broke his arm with the scythe. The
 Dwyers were the tenants who previously occu-
 pied the farm, situate upon part of the property
 of the Earl of Stradbroke, and who were eject-
 ed last March for non-payment of nearly three
 years rent.

Two shirts, spotted in several parts with
 blood, and a handle of a scythe, have been
 found concealed in the house of one of the fel-
 lows apprehended for the murder. Further
 proofs of this detestable conspiracy are hourly
 coming to light.

Honora Connell, sister to the deceased Daniel
 Connell, was on Thursday brought in on a car
 to the County Infirmary, where she continues
 under Surgical care.
