On Thursday, the Mayor held three inquisi- tions; the first upon the body of John Temple, a sailor of the Elizabeth of Harrington, who fell by accident from the vessel a few days before, and was drowned; the second upon the body of John Mulqueeney, who died suddenly that morning in Mary-street; and the third upon the body of Stephen Osborne, who died the previous night in the County Infirmary, from the stroke of a cable which he received on Sunday, the 28th ult. on Shannon-quay. Verdicts accordingly were returned in these cases. The last melancholy accident terminated beyond expecta- tion fatally to the unfortunate sufferers, one of whom, Michael Cronin, a mason, has left a widow and four children totally unprovided for. The other, Osborne, was a most ingenious self-taught mechanic, and his loss is much regretted.

An armed party attacked the house of a farmer named Cuddehy, near Mullinahoune, County Tipperary, on Wednesday, and wounded several of the inmates most seriously; the perpetrators had five fire arms which seemed in as good condition as soldiers musquets.

A Rock notice was left at Mr. Dexter's, near New Inn, County Tipperary, on Friday night, threatening him with destruction if he did not give higher wages to his labourers.

We have deep regret in recording the death of Thomas Bennett, Esq. by the accidental explosion of his own fowling-piece on Thursday morning last, in the vicinity of Templemore.--- He was a young Gentleman of the most agreeable disposition, was universally esteemed, and has left an amiable widow and child, with most respectable relatives and friends, to lament his loss. He went out that morning to fowl, accompanied by a young boy: about two miles from home, after crossing a drain, he desired the boy to hand him the gun; the boy having handed him the gun with the muzzle foremost, it went off: when its contents, consisting of duck-shot, entered at one side of Mr. Bennett's navel, and lodged between the skin and flesh of his back! Every assistance was rendered by Surgeons Kinsley, Anderson, and Glynn;---a great portion of his bowels having protruded through the wound, were replaced by the Surgeons, and the most powerful medicines administered; but it was all in vain!--a blood-vessel had been ruptured; inwardly by the shot, and he bled to death by 7 o'clock in the evening. It was melancholy to hear him, notwithstanding the most dreadful agony call for his wife (who was then in Kille-naule on a visit with her brother) and bidding farewell to all around him.
