evidence of Mr. Blackburne before the Select Committee of the House of Commons, to sustain the foul accusation that the Palatines of Glanasheen were engaged in the late disturbances in the County of Limerick. We say it, without fear of contradiction, that his evidence is set down *incorrectly*, and garbled, (*wilfully garbled*), and that his reply to the question was, "that the persons *attacked* were *Protestants*." This fact Mr. Blackburne, as well as every Gentleman connected with the County, is fully aware of: and the conviction of some of the party concerned, (not one of whom was a Palatine,) is an additional proof, if such were wanted. The evidence from the Parliamentary Report on this subject shall appear in our next.

Yesterday, the Mayor held an inquisition at Ballyseeda on the body of John Fitzgerald, a fine young lad, who was choked by a potatoe whilst eating his supper on St. Stephen's night. Verdict accordingly.

A dangerous riot is expected at the fair of Kilmeedy on Friday, the Police have received information of the intended outrage, and will be on the alert to preserve the peace.

Two sheep were killed and taken away, on Thursday night, from a farmer named O'Donnel, living near Patrick'swell; and several robberies of the same description have latterly occurred in the same neighbourhood.

The entire of the 99th Regiment has left Glasgow for Leith, where they will embark for Portsmouth, and are succeeded by a division of the 72d Regiment, stationed in Edinburgh.
