Johns, was opposed by the widow and re-

 and unnecessary opposition,

Walsh, discharged without opposition—Rev.
 n., detaining creditor.

Donnell, discharged without opposition—de-
 btor, Connor Cunneen—no assignee.

Kelly, was opposed on behalf of William
 —Insolvent is a Cornet on half-pay of the 7th

 necessaries. It appearing to the Court that an
 principle always influenced his pecuniary trans-
 actions that every disposition was evinced by him to
