Yesterday morning, a man was found lying on the road between Croagh and Rathkeale in this County, in a dying state, being wounded in the head by a shot. When first discovered he could speak a little, said his name was M'Carthy, from Kerry; he was removed to Rathkeale, where he died this morning-no trace has as yet been discovered of the Perpetrators of this inhuman murder, nor any cause assigned, as he was apparently a pour creature, without shoes or stockings.
