Yesterday and last night being favourable, brought many farmers to market; notwithstanding which, prices supported last quotations, and Wheat brought 1s. 8d. to 1s. 8½d. per stone for Red; and 1s. 8d. to 1s. 9d. per stone for White.—We have had a good supply of boat Oats, which brought 10½d. per stone, in general.—Barley, 12½d. per stone to 12¾d. for very prime—Flour rates as follows, 4s. per bag, for firsts, 36s. for 2ds, and 20s. for 3ds.—Oatmeal has declined to 11s. 6d. per cwt.—Potatoes, owing to a small supply, are 4½d. to 5d. per stone.—Baconed Pork, 38s. to 42s. per cwt. and several buyers have commented; Bacon Pigs, 46s. @ 48s. per cwt.—Beef, 4½d. to 5d. per lb.—Mutton, 5½d. to 6½d. per lb; and Veal, 6d. to 10d. per lb—Good hand-scuthed Flax, from 5s. to 6s. per stone, freely: Mill-scuthed, do.
