John Carey, a cattle-jobber, travelling from Rath-
keale to this City, in the caravan, on Sunday morning,
was found dead in his seat, on arriving in town. On
learning the sad occurrence, an inquest was immediately
held by the Mayor, and from the testimony of Mr.
Parker of the Commissariat Department, who was a pas-
senger in the vehicle, it would appear that the deceased
had drank during the ride a considerable quantity of
spirits and milk punch, the morning being extremely
sharp, and from the effects of which he became quite
stupified. Surgeon Franklin had no doubt that such had
been the cause of his death, having induced a fit of
apoplexy. When his condition was observed, every
assistance was afforded him, but human aid was unavail-
ing. Carey was a young man in comfortable circum-
stances, and but a few weeks married.

The Fair of Six-Mile-Bridge, was one of the best
that had taken place for a number of years back, all kind
of Stock, &c. were in demand, and brought high prices.
About two o'clock factions assembled, and rioting com-
menced—but that active Magistrate Capt. D'Alton, hav-
ing called out the detachment of the 84th regiment, com-
manded by Captain Burrard, and the Magistrate giving
orders to the Military to load with ball cartridge before
some hundreds, and as the party advanced to the Police
Barrack, one of the factions was coming from the fair
green, when Capt. D'Alton, gave orders to the Military
to charge in close column, and Serjeant Jameson and his
Police having darted in among them, made several
prisoners who were immediately lodged in Bridewell, and
the remainder of the ruffians made off—tranquility was
restored, and the business of the fair commenced as usual;
at eight o'clock, the public houses were cleared out, and
shut-up.—The Cork buyers purchased near five hundred
head of fat cattle for slaughter.—Some lots of young
bullocks fetched 14 guineas.—Two hundred head belong-
ing to one great feeder left the fair unsold—the prices
looked for being too high.

At the fair of Clonroad, on Saturday, horses of every
description and age were in demand, and a great number
of purchases made. Pigs in the early part of the day
were purchased at from 30s. to 33s. the cwt. but towards
evening they advanced in price. Cattle were not in
demand.

Six In-calf Cows were taken up by the Police, at Main,
on Saturday night, which were stolen, and found in the

Harnett, who are committed to the County Jail, by G.
Massy, Esq.

UNAUTHORISED APPOINTMENT.—A person appointed

for an assistant, declined the services of this person, who
has therefore returned to Dublin, and thereby saved the
Public an additional charge of 60l. per Annum
