# The Limerick Chronicle

SATURDAY, DECEMBER 10.

On Wednesday night, a rick of hay, the property of a farmer named Murrane, at Meelick, was maliciously set on fire, but an alarm being given by a carman passing, it was extinguished. It is probable but for the mildness of the night, several stacks of corn would be consumed. The soldiers and police were removed from thence about a week ago.

Thursday evening, the Mayor held an inquest on the body of Daniel Connors, of Labasheeda, County Clare, who, in the afternoon of that day, fell into the river at O'Neill's-Quay, and was drowned.

Mr. Balmer, Chief of Constabulary in this County, attended the fair of Mount Pelier, on Thursday last, with a party of mounted and dismounted Constables, to keep the peace, as one those disgraceful faction fights, hitherto so prevalent here, was intended between two parties, named Molony and M'Cormack, and which would have been attended with the worst consequences had it not been for the interference of the Civil Power. Several persons were taken into custody for breaches of the peace, all of whom are bound to appear at the next Quarter Sessions to be held at Limerick. Sir Hugh D. Massey, with a party of the Clare Police, also attended,

That active Magistrate, George Massey, Esq. of Glenwilliam, forwarded on Wednesday last, by the Police route to Listowel, two notorious offenders named John Sullivan and Daniel Hartnett, charged on oath with feloniously stealing six cows from the lands of Gorthnamagower, in the County Kerry, on the night of the 2d inst. They were stopped by the Police stationed at Maine, in this County, returning from patrol before day light the following morning.

This day John Hamilton, was fined twenty shillings for throwing squibs of gun-powder in the streets last night, and William Henderson, for the same offence, ordered to stand two hours in the pillory.—The Mayor and Magistrates are determined to punish offences of this kind which laterly prevail extensively in this City.

The Royals have not yet left Dublin, being detained in consequence of a survey of their accoutrements.

The 9th and 21st will, on arrival from the West Indies, be placed on the Irish establishment.

The depot of the 42d Highlanders is to be stationed at Edinburgh.

The depots of the 1st battalion Royal Scots, and the 25th Foot, will be stationed at Albany Barracks, Isle of Wight.

The 53d Regiment, in garrison at Portsmouth, will shortly embark for service in Ireland.

The Depot of the 12th Foot had not embarked for Ireland on the 30th ult. The baggage had been on board the Borodino transport for ten days previously to that day, but the gale has been so violent as to render it impossible for the troops to embark, or have any communication with the vessel.
