For nearly half a century Mr. Dugdale was an eminent bookseller in Dublin, and few persons have, during so long a period, deserved or enjoyed more of the public esteem. As a man of business, the strictest order, punctuality, and integrity, marked all his transactions; a polished amenity of manners secured the respect of those with whom he had occasional intercourse; while a well informed mind and a ceaseless anxiety to make all around him happy, rendered him the delight of the domestic and the social circle. But these were not the chief of Mr. Dugdale's excellencies—in his character the Apostolic precept was strikingly exemplified; while "not slothful in business," he was "servent in spirit, serving the Lord." Mr. Dugdale, in early life, became attached to the system of Methodism, as taught by the venerable Wesley whose friendship and intimacy he largely enjoyed, and whose oft repeated injunctions to his followers, he respected by maintaining a sincere and ardent attachment to the Established Church to the close of life. That close was eminently peaceful and happy: relying with unwavering confidence on the merits of his Redeemer, he departed from the stage of time, in ease and certain hope of a joyful resurrection.
