On Thursday, a very melancholy and unforeseen occurrence took place at Bilboa, in this County, at the residence of a farmer, John Molony. His son, between 12 and 13 years old, contrived to enter the apartment of a Policeman who lodged in the house, and seizing a horse pistol which lay within reach, he presented the dangerous weapon at his younger sister, and told her in a playful mood he would shoot her. The words had scarcely escaped him, when the charge unexpectedly exploded, and prostrated his little victim on the floor, the ball having torn away a portion of the frontal bone.— Surgical assistance was soon had, but unfortunately no hopes are entertained of the recovery of the innocent creature.

Last night, a car man, of the name of Michael Ryan, from Nenagh, was knocked down in Clare-street, and getting off with their booty. One of the Notes taken from him was for £23 19s. 10½d., and the public would do well to stop such.

On Wednesday, the 8th instant, Serjeant Baxter, of the Owey and Arra Police, stationed at Kilcolman, apprehended, at Carrigatone, Cornelius M'Loughlin, charged with the murder of Patrick Connors, in December last, who has evaded justice for some time past; he is committed to Clontmel Jail to stand his trial. Serjeant Baxter also apprehended John and Michael Gleeson, in whose possession he found a quantity of mutton, wool, and tallow, for which they could not account; they were accordingly convicted before the Magistrates at Petty Sessions, and fined in a penalty of 10l. each, or two months' imprisonment. The conduct of Serjeant Baxter on this occasion, as well as many others, is entitled to much praise, and has uniformly met with the approbation of the Magistrates in Nenagh.

Patrick Hannan, a countryman, died this morning in the County Infirmary, from the effects of a fractured skull, received at a hurling match in this County. An inquest was held this day by Alderman Watson, when a verdict was returned "that he came by his death, by a blow of a hurly, from John Gorman, of Knockroe, on Sunday last.

Patrick Dillane, an aged man 80 years, charged with sheep-stealing, died last night in the County Gaol.

A man of the name of Fleming, died yesterday, in Killarney, from the excessive use of spirits. It appears that a carman in charge of a puncheon of spirits from Cork, for a shop-keeper in this town, broached the vessel on the road, and invited Fleming to partake of it, which he did to such excess as to cause his death.

A man was drowned a few days since in endeavouring to ford the river Loune, where it issues from the Lake of Killarney. Another man in company was saved with great difficulty, by the exertions of some of the domestics of John O'Connell, Esq. of Greua.

On Sunday night, Michael Ready, a countryman, while drinking with others at Lisronagh, received several blows of a musket, which fractured his head, and caused his death next morning, at his residence, Donoughmore, near Clontmel. A verdict of wilful murder is returned against Thomas Hayes and James Phelan, who have absconded.

Considerable damage was done to the New Works at the Salmon-Weir by the storm of Monday night—the banks of the river suffered also, as breaches have been made in several places.

On Saturday evening, a poor woman fell into the pan of the Upper Lock of the Canal, and would inevitably have perished, but for the timely aid of a man of the name of Patrick Carey, who went down by the flood-gate, and rescued her.

At a meeting of the Board of the Cork House of Industry and Lunatic Asylum, on Tuesday, the meeting of physician was postponed indefinitely. A dispute ensued as to the disproportion of members of the Board, on which there are only 22 from the County while there are 68 from the City.

The Treasurer of the County Limerick Fox-hunting Club acknowledges the receipt of £57 10s. from the Stewards of the late Limerick Races, being the amount of their collections, after paying all engagements.
