SPRING SESSIONS, 1826.

County of Limerick, } THE GENERAL QUARTER SESSIONS of the Peace in and for said County, will be held at RATHKEALE, in and for the Division of Rathkeale, on FRIDAY, the 31st Day of March next; and at LIMERICK, in and for the Division of Limerick, on FRIDAY, the 7th Day of April next. All Processes must be entered on the first day of the Sessions at each place — otherwise they will not be received. The Civil Bill business will be proceeded on precisely at Nine o'Clock in the Forenoon of the first day, at each place, which will be continued for the three first days. The Grand Jury will be sworn in at Twelve o'Clock on the first day at each place; and when Bills of Indictment are sent before them, the Civil Bill business will be resumed. All Prosecutors, are required to attend on the first day, at Twelve o'Clock; those who do not, their recognizances will be forthwith estreated.

The Court will proceed with Criminal Business on the morning of the fourth day, which will be continued until finished; and all Prosecutors, Traversers, and others bound to appear by Recognizance, are required to attend. As nothing will more facilitate the Criminal Business than having the Bills of Indictment prepared for the Grand Jury on the first day, the Magistrates of said County are particularly requested to return their Informations and Recognizances ten days, at least, previous to the Sessions.
