WEDNESDAY, MARCH 8.

On Monday, the Mayor held an Inquest at the County  
Infirmity, on the body of Johanna Kelly, an aged female,  
who it appeared was killed by a car which rolled over her  
in Denmark-street.

On Sunday, an inquest was held by Alderman Watson,  
in the absence of the Mayor, on the body of John Costel-  
loe, when it was apparent that the unfortunate man died in  
Williams's-lane, from drinking spirituous liquors to excess.

On Sunday night last, a cabin and some turf, with the  
furniture, were maliciously set on fire near Mungret, and  
totally consumed by a party of incendiaries, who beat the  
inmates.

The public school at Croffin, County Clare, under  
the patronage of Mr. Syngé of Dysart, was attacked by  
a party of wretches on Thursday night, who fired several  
shots to terrify the inmates of an adjoining house, and  
then set fire to the premises which were reduced to a heap  
of smoking ruins.

A few nights ago, a party of armed men broke into  
the house of James Ryan, at Littleton, County of  
Tipperary, and having put the whole family on their  
faces, took a gun that lay across the beams, and asked  
for the lock that was in the drawer next the door. On  
getting it they proceeded to the house of a man living  
next door, and took from him a gun and two pistols.—  
Three of them, it is said, are taken, and one intends  
turning King's evidence.

Sixteen Sub-Constables are to be added to each barony  
in the County Cork.

On Monday an extent from Government was executed  
by the Sheriff of Cork, on the estate and effects of Messrs.  
Leslie, bankers, for a sum of £50,000 due to the crown  
since 1822. This must prove very injurious to the nu-  
merous creditors whose claims are rendered nugatory  
until the amount of the above order is levied.

The Limerick and Waterford Rail-Road Bill passed  
the first reading in the House of Commons, on Thursday

In the Recorder's Court of Cork, on Monday

it in a burial place different from what was intended.—  
They were sentenced to imprisonment for 6 months.

The freedom of the Royal Burgh of New Galloway  
Scotland, has been presented to Sir James C. Anderson

A few nights ago, Mr. George O'Grady, Officer  
Excise, assisted by Lieutenant Gardiner and a party  
of the 11th Foot, detected three extensive stills in the  
parish of Kennagh, near Clonakilty.
