The British Officers now in Ireland, who served with
the Portuguese Army, in the Peninsula, will have their
claims put in course of payment by the Deputy Treasurer
of Chelsea Hospital, in Dublin.

The Pensions of Officers' Widows, in future, to be
issued quarterly, will be in course of payment on the 4th
April, in Dublin.

On Monday evening a desperate riot took place in
Thurles, between two factions, closely connected by the
ties of relationship, but constantly seeking the destruc-

tion of each other. On the Police interfering they were
assailed most furiously by both parties, and compelled
to retreat to their barracks. Mr. Nicholson, a Magis-
trate, lost not a moment in proceeding to the scene, and
was met by the Police, and assailed by a shower of
stones from the rioters. He ordered them to follow him
to the military barracks to get their assistance, when on
their way they were again assailed in so violent a manner
with stones, that the Magistrate ordered them, should
the mob persevere, to defend themselves. The Police
arrived at the barrack; the rioters still assailing them
with every description of missiles until they were actu-
ally goaded to fire, and two of the disturbers were shot
dead and many severely wounded. One, a boy of 13
years of age, is beyond hope of recovery, and from the
chest of another a ball was extracted.—Fourteen of the
ringleaders are in custody.

Wednesday, Mathew M'Inerheny, found guilty at the
last Assizes, for forcibly taking away a young woman
named Margaret Donnellao, from the House of her
father at Claduff, in January last, underwent the final
sentence of the law at the drop of the new jail, in Ennis.

Two of the M'Namara's, father and son, instrumental
in procuring sentence of death and nearly the execution
of two men and two women at last Ennis Assizes, for aid-
ing as was alleged, in violating the person of Bridget
M'Namara, have since died, under circumstances that
lead to various imaginary conjectures among the peasantry.
The father died suddenly and the son broke his neck in
falling out of a public house.
