The Police arrived at the barrack; the rioters still assailing them with every description of missiles until they were actually goaded to fire, and two of the disturbers were shot dead and many severely wounded. One, a boy of 13 years of age, is beyond hope of recovery, and from the chest of another a ball was extracted .- Fourteen of the ringleaders are in custody.
