Butler, an ejectment for non-payment of rent of the lands of Lisduff, there was a Verdict for Plaintiff. In Manning v. Mandeville, an action of trespass for distraining and impounding a horse, there was a Verdiet for Plaintiff, 20 guineas and costs. Kennedy and others r-Lady Farnham, was left to a reference. Jacks v.
