The City Cork Criminal Business finished on Tuesday before Justice Torrens, without any capital conviction, and the County is expected to terminate this day.

A numerous and respectable meeting of country gentlemen was held in Cork, on Saturday, to consider the best means of obtaining a more fair and equal representation on the Grand Jury of the County, Col. Travers in the chair. The injury sustained by some of the baronies from want of such representation was forcibly detailed. resolutions were passed, and a deputation composed of Thomas Hungerford, Richard Townsend, and Captain James L. Stawell, appointed to wait on the Judges with a copy of the resolutions.

In the Clonmel Record Court, on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, the following cases were tried:—The Hon. James King v. T. & D. Condon, for the amount of a promissory note—Verdict for Plaintiff, 35l. In Kenny v. Hodgins, an ejectment to recover the lands of Curragh-anoddy, in Upper Ormond, there was also a Verdict for Plaintiff. In Hodgins v. Kenny, to recover monies received for plaintiff's use, a Verdict was had for 40l. In James, Lessee of Lord Kirkland, v. Milo Bourke and E. Butler, an ejectment for non-payment of rent of the lands of Lisduff, there was a Verdict for Plaintiff. In Manning v. Mandeville, an action of trespass for distraining and impounding a horse, there was a Verdict for Plaintiff, 20 guineas and costs. Kennedy and others v. Lady Farnham, was left to a reference. Jacks v. Grace was settled. The important case Garde v. Clutterbuck, has not yet been decided.

At Clonmel, on Thursday, Patrick Connors, and Patrick and John Leamy, were found guilty of burglariously entering and setting fire to the house of John Sheehan. David Condon was convicted of the aggravated manslaughter of Thomas Looby, and sentenced to transportation for life. Richard Burke, for the murder of George Groves, at Cloughjordan, on the 12th July, was found guilty of manslaughter, and sentenced to transportation for life.

At a late hour on Sunday night, a corpse was found drowned in the river near Tervoe. An inquisition having been held the next day by the Mayor, it appeared that it was the body of James Flaherty, who fell off the strand about a month ago in a state of intoxication, whilst returning from this City to his house in the Co. Clare.

At a meeting of the Magistrates of Waterford, at Dungarvan, on Monday, it was resolved by a majority to apply to Government for a stipendiary Police Magistrate to be stationed at Kilmacthomas, with a sufficient armed force.

Captain Wilson is at Thurles, investigating the late riot there. Three men of the names of Norris, Long, and Ryan, are those who have lost their lives by that affray, up to the period of our last account, and four or five are wounded—one of them a youth, is in imminent danger.

A Bill has been brought into Parliament, which declares that it is expedient to regulate processes under Civil Bill Act. 36 Geo. III. chap. 25, and enacts that at the next Sessions, after passing of this Act, officers shall be appointed by the Assistant-Barristers to serve processes; and enacts that no processes, except those served by those officers, shall be held to be valid. This will be a good measure, and will put an end to the scandalous practice of process-serving now in use.
