In a few weeks the works to extend a Canal from
Portarlinton to Mountmellick will be commenced, and
it is stated that the cut will be continued to Roscrea.

An extensive Steam Engine was landed in Waterford,
on Wednesday, for the mines at Coolquill, Co. Tipperary.

A man, named Murray, a shos-maker, died suddenly
in Tarbert, on Wednesday.

Mr. Lennon, of the Commercial Hotel, Waterford,
was found drowned in Dublin, on Wednesday night.

Yesterday, James Bennett, Esq. Coroner, held an In-
quest, at Croom, in this County, on the body of James
Sullivan, who died from drinking whiskey to excess.

The first stone of a new bridge is to be laid in Cork,
on Monday.

There was a grand ball and supper at the Clansicard
Hotel, in Galway, on Tuesday patronised by Colonel Sir
Hugh Gough and Major Fleming, of the 22d Regiment,
and several Gentlemen of the town and county.

This day, the Steward of the House of Industry re-
ceived a quantity of pigs' heads, pork, and offal—some
firkins, stools, plates, piggins, and chairs, seized by the
Mayor from Standings in the Streets. The Mayor, also,
this day, sent to the Female Orphan School a basket of
seized sea fish, and vegetables; to the widows in St.
Michael's Parish, some cabbage; and to the widows of
St. John's, one can of gruel, two chairs, and two cans.

The Fair of Fedamore, yesterday, was the highest
which occurred this season; cattle of every kind seemed
advanced in price—40 guineas were given for three
Springers, and Milch Cows in general were very dear;
Strippers went from £5 to £10, and young stock propor-
tionably high.

ings in the public street.

A quantity of unsound fish exposed for sale, yesterday,
was seized by the Clerk of the Market, and burned by
order of the Mayor.

The Steward of the Mendicity acknowledges to have
received from the City Police, one linen sheet and four
stone of potatoes, for the use of the Institution.

On Wednesday evening the remains of Mr. Henry
Wheeler, were accompanied to St. Munchin's Church-
yard, by Lodge 271, (in full costume) of which he was
an old and distinguished member, as also by Lodge No.
13, the Mayor, Master—who, with all Members in town,
attended and marched, both Lodges bearing the usual
insignia, &c. and the Band of the County Limerick
playing a solemn dirge on the occasion. This, we believe,
was the first Masonic procession here within the last five
years. Several thousands of his fellow citizens also
attended.
