The prisoner produced no witnesses, but alleged that he was drunk, and did not remember anything about it. The Court observed that drunkness was no excuse for robbery. The Jury consulted a few moments and returned a verdict of guilty.

The Judge said, he was sorry to find, that a person, who had served his country well, should be placed in such a discreditable situation, he would suppose that the prisoner had drank too much, but people can not make an excuse for their conduct by depriving themselves of reason, and reducing themselves to the condition of brute beasts.

The prisoner again spoke—he said he was wounded in the leg at the battle of Vittoria, on the 13th of June 1813, that he had cause to retaember the day, for his brother was killed near him in the same engagement, and he was a soldier in the 43d flagt, his feelings were affected, and he was drinking on the anniversary; his officers could give a character of him, and his worship, the Mayor.

The Judge replied, that the Mayor had already mentioned the character he had from his officers, but if they would certify in behalf of his character, he would consider the application before passing sentence. The prisoner then thanked his Lordship and the Mayor, and retired from the bar.

The Court was adjourned at half past 6 o'clock to next day.

THURSDAY, JULY 13.

Margaret Clanchy was convicted of stealing a coat, the property of John Meany, and sentenced to six months' imprisonment.

Esther Fitzgerald, for stealing wearing apparel—Guilty. Sentenced to four months' imprisonment.

James Molony was indicted for assaulting Daniel Dwycr,

at Old Clare-street, on 20th May, then and there giving him one mortal blow with a stone on the head, whereof he languished and died 11th June, following. Acquitted.

William Dinan, James M' Makon, Michael Malone, Thomas Collins, and Edmond Walsh, were indicted for forcibly violating the person of Margaret Williams, in Nicholas street, on the 19th of June. Another indictment charged the former with the actual violation, and the others with aiding and assisting therein. The prosecutrix, a female of about thirty six years of age, said she was a widow, and attacked by the prisoners about twelve o'clock at night, and that the outrage was committed against her consent. It appeared in evidence, she was a woman of light character, and after a tedious investigation of the circumstances, the Jury acquitted all the prisoners, although the testimony against Dinan was rather of a strong nature, and reckoned sufficient to ensure a conviction. The prisoners received good characters.

FRIDAY, JULY 14.

Baron Pennefather went into cases of Nisi Priss, in the County Record Court.

M. Cann, a. Goodbody—Mr. O'Loghlen opened the pleadings in this cause, John M. Cann, was Plaintiff, Thomas Goodbody Defendant. It was an action of Assumpsit, to recover the value of 200 bags of flour, the declaration contained special counts, and the usual money counts. The loss sustained was stated in evidence at £158, and the Jury gave a verdict for the full amount, £146 British.

Murphy v Bolton—Mr O'Loghien opened the pleadings in this cause; Allan Murphy was Plaintiff, Lyndon Bolton Defendant. It was an Action of Assumpsit on a Policy of Insurance, effected the 25th June, 1824, on the life of the late Thomas Francis Wilkinson, for the sum of 850l Irish, with the St Patrick Insurance Company. After proceeding at considerable length with the case, his Lordship charged the Jury, and they gaves a verdict that they were satisfied as to the age and health of
