The whole of the clothing delivered to the English

main constantly embodied, from which the regular army
is to be kept complete by allowing a portion of the Militia
to exist therein annually, which will dispense with the
present mode of recruiting the Army, and prevent the
numerous illegal enlistments of Militia men, which now
take place into the Line.
