On Tuesday and Wednesday, the 19th Regiment em-

Two men, named Kearney and Tuohy, from Ballina,
near Killaloe, were arrested in town yesterday, having in
their possession, sheep which were stolen from Michael
Diegan, Esq. They are committed for trial.

On Thursday night last, a party of men attacked the
house of a dairy-man, named Hassett, at Kibreadren, the
inmates made a bold resistance and beat them off. A
similar attack was made on a man named Mead, who also
beat them off.

A riot took place between two parties returning from
the fair of Askeaton on Monday last, one man named
Cormick, was so dreadfully beaten, that there remains
little or no hopes of his recovery.

Yesterday evening a small boy, named Mullins, fell
out of a boat near the North Strand, and was drowned.
The vital spark was not totally extinct when the body was
taken out of the water—but it had fled for ever before
the usual remedies were applied.

Daniel Ussher, a sailor, of the brig Maria, of White-
haven, was drowned in Waterford, on Wednesday, by
falling from the bowsprit of his vessel.

John Leahy, a labourer, was burned to death this week
at Killingly, County Cork, in a lime-kiln, belonging to
the Rev. John M'Namara, P. P. of Douglas and
Killingly.

A man was killed in Rutland-street, Cork, on Thurs-
day, by a horse and cart going over him—the driver sitting
on the shafts.

In conformity with a requisition, the Provost of Tralee
has called a meeting of the inhabitants, to prevent the
shameful profanation of the Sabbath in that town.
